Latest Updates you need to know in Maharashtra

Fog Adds Charm to Panchgani's Scenic Beauty

Panchgani is experiencing a winter-like, foggy weather shift in peak summer, boosting tourism at popular spots like Sydney Point. Tourists are enjoying the views and cool breeze, benefiting local businesses. Officials advise caution due to low visibility. This unexpected weather is a pleasant surprise for visitors.

Heavy Tourist Rush to Sinhagad and Rajgad Forts

Massive weekend tourist crowds at Sinhagad and Rajgad forts caused severe traffic jams up to 10 km long with four-hour delays due to narrow roads and high vehicle numbers. On Sunday, Sinhagad alone saw 2,103 vehicles. The chaos stranded visitors, prompting calls for stricter vehicle control and better infrastructure for peak tourist days.

Rain and Fog Bring Unexpected Bliss to Mahabaleshwar

Unseasonal summer rain and fog created a beautiful, popular tourist destination in Mahabaleshwar. The pleasant weather led to high footfall in markets and viewpoints as visitors sought relief from the heat. Increased traffic, however, caused congestion and raised pollution concerns, prompting authorities to stress the need for improved traffic management to protect the environment and visitor experience.

Tourism Mitra: Ensuring Safe & Responsible Tourism

The Department of Tourism (DoT) is launching Tourism Mitra, a specially trained task force deployed at major tourist spots to ensure visitor safety and promote responsible travel.

Key roles:

- Guide tourists on local laws, culture, and attractions
- Monitor adventure tourism safety
- Promote sustainable practices and ban plastic use
- Ensure safety of women and all visitors

Tourism Mitras will mostly be retired police or security personnel, appointed via an outsourced agency, supported by DoT's training and funding.
